This is our children's message for today

Today our lesson is about the story of Jesus. Before Jesus left his disciples, he told his disciples that he was not afraid. He even was going (when he left the disciples) to take the throne of David. Do you guys remember the story of King David? Maybe, you can remember the story the King David and Goliath.
